Dear Mr. Lüthi:

Pursuant to Judicial Panel on Multidistrict Litigation Rule 7.6(c)(ii), this Court respectfully suggests that the case *Scovil v. Kang v. Regeneration Technologies, Inc., et al*, No. 07-160 (D. Haw.), which was consolidated with another case in this district "for coordinated or consolidated pretrial proceedings," be remanded to the transferor court.

This Court recently decided summary judgment motions, which dismissed the implant-related claims brought by Plaintiff Scovil against Regeneration Technologies, Inc. ("RTI"), Spinalgraft Technologies, and Medtronic.² After the Court's decision, the parties signed a consent order dismissing Plaintiff Scovil's fear of disease claim with prejudice and Defendant/Third-Party Plaintiff Tea Sung Kang's Third-Party Complaint with prejudice. As such, the only remaining claims in this action are state tort counts arising from the motor vehicle collision between Messrs. Scovil and Kang. Because further proceedings on Scovil's remaining tort claims would be more efficiently performed in the court where the trial will be held, I believe

this action is ready for remand.

In sum, the Court has completed consolidated pretrial proceedings in the *Scovil* action to the extent practicable. There being nothing left for this Court to adjudicate on the motor vehicle tort claim, the Court requests that the *Scovil* action be remanded to the transferor court.
