CONDITIONAL TRANSFER ORDER (CTO-2)
AND SIMULTANEOUS SEPARATION AND REMAND OF CERTAIN CLAIMS

On June 9, 2014, the Panel transferred 15 civil action(s) to the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York for coordinated or consolidated pretrial proceedings pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1407. *See* _F.Supp.2d_ (J.P.M.L. 2014). Since that time, no additional action(s) have been transferred to the Southern District of New York. With the consent of that court, all such actions have been assigned to the Honorable Jesse M. Furman.

It appears that the action on this conditional transfer order comprises claims relating to: (1) an alleged ignition switch defect in General Motors vehicles, which involve questions of fact that are common to the previously centralized MDL No. 2543 actions; and (2) an alleged front axle right half shaft fracture defect in General Motors vehicles, which do not involve such common questions of fact.

Pursuant to Rule 7.1 of the Rules of Procedure of the Judicial Panel on Multidistrict Litigation, this action is transferred under 28 U.S.C. § 1407 to the Southern District of New York for the reasons stated in the order of June 9, 2014, and, with the consent of that court, assigned to the Honorable Jesse M. Furman. All claims in this action unrelated to the alleged ignition switch defect are separated and simultaneously remanded to the Central District of California.

This order does not become effective until it is filed in the Office of the Clerk of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. The transmittal of this order to said Clerk shall be stayed 7 days from the entry thereof. If any party files a notice of opposition with the Clerk of the Panel within this 7-day period, the stay will be continued until further order of the Panel.

Inasmuch as no objection is pending at this time, the stay is lifted.
