CONDITIONAL REMAND ORDER

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Rule 10.4(a), the parties shall furnish the Clerk for the Southern District of West Virginia with a stipulation or designation of the contents of the record to be remanded.

Inasmuch as no objection is pending at this time, the stay is lifted.

ORDER AND SUGGESTION OF REMAND

Pending is a Consent Motion for Suggestion of Remand to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta Division, filed October 10, 2016. [ECF No. 14]. In the Consent Motion, the parties state that plaintiffs originally filed their complaint against C. R. Bard, Inc. in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta Division, on May 19, 2014, case number 1:14-cv-1507. On June 18, 2014, the instant action was transferred to MDL 2187 as a tagalong case.

The parties represent that the instant case involves a hernia mesh patch product manufactured by C. R. Bard, Inc. ("Bard"), and therefore, this particular case is not appropriate for inclusion in the Bard transvaginal mesh MDL, MDL 2187, pending before this court. Instead, the parties agree that the correct venue for this action is the transferor court where this case was originally filed, the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta Division.




Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1407 and the Rules for Multidistrict Litigation promulgated thereunder, specifically Rule 10.1(b), the Consent Motion for Suggestion of Remand to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta Division is **GRANTED**. The court suggests that this action be remanded to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta Division.

Upon receipt of an order to remand from the Clerk of the Judicial Panel on Multidistrict Litigation (“MDL Panel”), the Clerk of this court is directed to transmit the following to the transferor court: (1) a copy of the member case docket sheet; and (2) the entire file for the member case.

Finally, it is **ORDERED** that Plaintiffs’ Motion to Transfer [ECF No. 13] is **DENIED** as moot.

The court **DIRECTS** the Clerk to send a copy of this Order and Suggestion of Remand to the Clerk of the MDL Panel, counsel of record and any unrepresented party.
