As the proud owner of a 2005 Ford F-250 diesel truck, I would like to object to the Proposed Settlement regarding certain repairs of the 6.0 L PowerStroke diesel engine.

In May, 2009, while pulling my trailer on a trip to Alaska, my truck misbehaved by belching black smoke and not shifting properly. I took it to the Ford dealership in Missoula, Montana for repairs. The dealership promptly made the repairs which included replacing the turbo unit. The repairs were done under warrantee at \$0 cost to me. The truck has performed perfectly since and even gets about 11 MPG while pulling a 9,000 lb. trailer. I couldn't ask for more.

Today I received a letter announcing a class action suit against Ford. It appears that a group of lawyers wants to pad their already inflated salaries by suing Ford. \$14 million lawyer fees for a \$150,000 plaintiff's settlement is absurd. Thanks to the lawyers for inviting me into the class, but I want no part of it.
