2	THE COURT: Sorry we're late, folks that are on the	
3	telephone. We've called to order the conference for the MDL	
4	2100, the Yasmin/YAZ MDL.	
5	Who will address these matters for plaintiff and	
6	for defendant? Michael Burg and Adam Hoeflich are coming to	
7	the podium, which was turned around for voir dire this	
8	morning. Sorry.	
9	MR. BURG: Good afternoon, Your Honor.	
10	MR. HOEFLICH: Good afternoon, Your Honor.	
11	THE COURT: Good afternoon. So the VTE	
12	settlements, how are those going?	
13	MR. HOEFLICH: Adam Hoeflich for the Bayer	
14	defendants, Your Honor.	
15	The VTE settlements continue. We are making	
16	progress and have now resolved several thousand of these	
17	cases. The number's now over 8,000. The negotiations on	
18	the remaining cases continue and we continue to make	
19	progress with plaintiffs.	
20	THE COURT: Okay. Thanks.	
21	MR. BURG: Your Honor, Michael Burg on behalf of	
22	the plaintiffs.	
23	I would agree with Mr. Hoeflich. There are still a	
24	number of cases to be resolved but we're making progress,	
25	and there's meetings set up and we continue to negotiate VTE	

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1	cases.
2	THE COURT: Thank you very much.
3	The gallbladder resolution program is proceeding.
4	I know there have been a few issues, but it's proceeding,
5	and I know we have some paperwork that's not in. We have
б	some that are in review. What's how would you sum it up,
7	gentlemen?
8	MR. BURG: Well, Your Honor, there's been some
9	problem getting paperwork back from counsel who represent
10	the people in the gallbladder settlement. As we have talked
11	about, we're going to be getting in contact with those
12	lawyers, but those that are listening in, we need to get
13	those documents back so we can get final resolution of all
14	the gallbladder cases. So again, the hold-up has been
15	trying to get the documents back, and we encourage everyone
16	to do it timely and get it done so we can move forward.
17	THE COURT: Each case is not a lot of money, I
18	know, but it is some money, and it doesn't make any sense
19	not to get the paperwork in and effectively forfeit that
20	money on behalf of to the detriment of clients. I don't
21	understand why people wouldn't get the documentation in and
22	risk forfeiture of the money. Just doesn't make any sense.
23	So I would encourage everybody out there to get your
24	documentation in and clients in line to collect the money.
25	So the next matter is the ATE and PFO cases.

1	MR. BURG: Yes, Your Honor. Again, Michael Burg.	
2	With regard to the ATE, we have a proposed plan	
3	with regard to setting up a schedule. I know the defendants	
4	also have a plan. We are going to submit them to Your Honor	
5	and we're going to do that prior to the next hearing in	
6	front of you, and then there'll be a determination by you,	
7	Your Honor, as to how we proceed with regard to the ATE	
8	cases.	
9	With regard to the PFO cases, we have submitted	
10	expert reports to the defendants. I've been told by	
11	Mr. Hoeflich that they are reviewing those, that some of	
12	those have been settled, some have not, and we continue to	
13	press forward to try to get resolution of those cases.	
14	THE COURT: Anything to add to that, Mr. Hoeflich?	
15	I guess not?	
16	MR. HOEFLICH: Nothing to add, Your Honor.	
17	THE COURT: Okay, thanks. So we'll have the next	
18	conference I didn't write it down. Did we decide on	
19	August the 4th?	
20	MR. BURG: August the 4th at 4:30 in the courtroom.	
21	THE COURT: Yeah. Going to be picking a jury again	
22	that day, so okay. So August the 4th at 4:30. If	
23	there's nothing else, we stand adjourned. Thanks, folks.
