I believe this law suit is frivolous and should not proceed. I purchased a front loading washer and dryer from Sears on December 5, 2007. When I noticed mold beginning to form in my washer, I took the common sense approach of drying it out after each use. That meant removing the detergent/softener tray, emptying any water remaining in it and keeping it out to dry over night. I use a paper towel to dry the cavity where that tray fits. I also dry the door to the washer and the wide rubber gasket around the door opening with a paper towel. Then I leave the door ajar. That whole procedure takes only a minute. Since adopting that practice, I have had no further mold.

I would agree that it would be nice if salespeople were to warn prospective customers of the need for that practice. However, anyone using front loading washers should be able to figure that out.
