PLAINTIFF'S UNOPPOSED MOTION TO APPROVE SETTLEMENT AS TO CLAIMS OF BARBARA J. FULMORE-SINGLETON

Plaintiff, Barbara J. Fulmore-Singleton, as Administrator of the Estate of Mary Fulmore, and Defendants Bayer Corporation, Bayer HealthCare Pharmaceuticals Inc., as successor in interest to Bayer Pharmaceuticals Corporation, and Bayer Schering Pharma AG, as successor in interest to Bayer HealthCare AG, jointly notified the Court on June 24, 2010 that they had reached a settlement agreement as to any and all claims of Barbara J. Fulmore-Singleton as Administrator of the Estate of Mary Fulmore related in any way to the administration of Trasylol.

The law of Plaintiff's decedent's domicile requires that a compromise of the type of claims asserted by the Administrator in this case be approved by a court of competent jurisdiction. Because this Court has specific knowledge as to (1) the status of the Trasylol Multi District Litigation generally, (2) the claims raised in this individual case, and (3) the parties' efforts to settle Trasylol actions in these proceedings, Plaintiff asserts that this

Court is best situated to approve the settlement of the Administrator's claims. As a result, Plaintiff now requests that this Court approve the settlement and issues the attached Order.

Specifically, Plaintiff has executed a Release, Indemnity and Assignment Agreement ("Agreement") in which she settled all claims brought on behalf of the Estate of Mary Fulmore. Plaintiff through her undersigned counsel represents to the Court that she was fully advised of the risks and benefits of pursuing these claims to trial and, after due consideration, Plaintiff voluntarily entered into the Agreement.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests the Court enter an Order approving the settlement, as requested.
